We have a team of 80 students representing GEIS on 24th November at the inter-school athletics at the Trusts Stadium. The day was a fun filled event with students and teachers dressing up in their mini school colours. The highlight at the stadium was the final relay event which featured the teachers team (Michael Norris, Mark Whitford, Nathan Dowding, Matt Short). The students were quietly confident of their chances of beating the teachers. The teachers proved to be too strong for our students winning by a country mile (only by 1.01 secs), a very proud moment for our staff.
