Bowen became the youngest player to represent New Zealand at recognised international level when she played in a New Zealand U-17 match against Australia U-17 on her 14th birthday in 2008. Later that year she travelled to the 2008 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup where she made a solitary appearance as a late substitute in a 3-1 win over Columbia. She again represented New Zealand in 2010, this time as captain at the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Trinidad and Tobago. Bowen made her senior international debut as a substitute in the NZ football ferns on 4 March 2011.



PAM CHIA

In 2011 Pamela Chia was the New Zealand Champion for her age in Karate. Pamela has represented New Zealand at the Oceania Championships, winning 2 bronze medals and a gold medal. In October she represented New Zealand at the 2011 World Championships in Malaysia.
